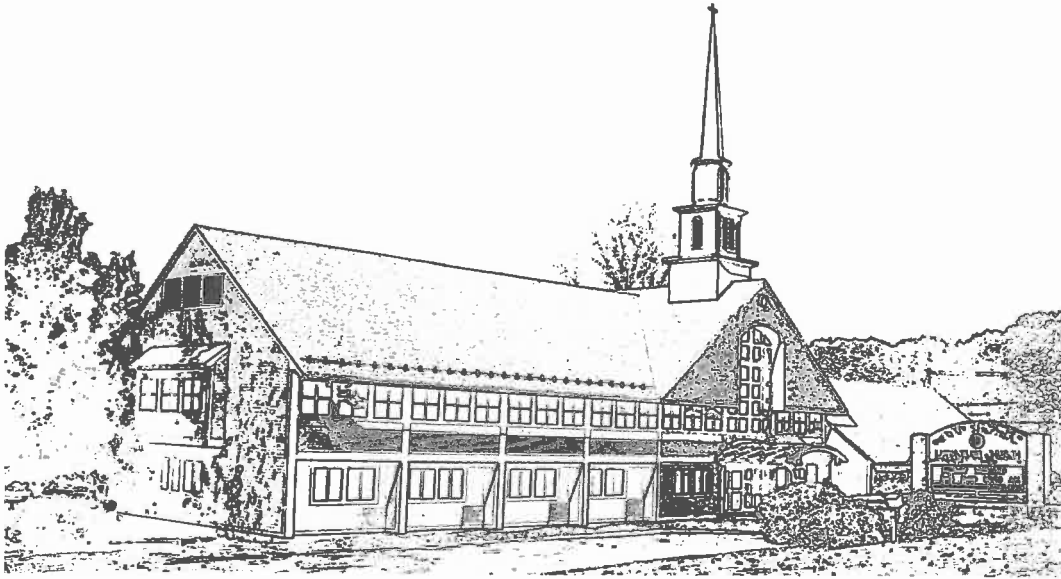

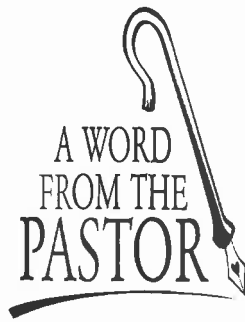

Dear Partners in Ministry,
 February is going to be a busy and deeply meaningful month at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. We begin the month in the season of Epiphany, the time of the church year when we celebrate Jesus' revelation to the world as the Messiah, the Son of God. Then it quickly becomes Lent.



February 7 is going to be an exciting day for several reasons. First, it looks very likely that our own Sandi D'Amico will be ordained that day. There is a congregation in the New England Synod that has a meeting scheduled for January 24 to vote to call our Vicar Sandi as their next pastor. If all goes well, and we are certainly praying it will, Sandi will be ordained at Concordia Lutheran Church in Manchester CT on the afternoon of Feb 7. We will have more details soon, and we will certainly plan a trip down there. The other event for the 7th is a baptism. My grandson, Elijah, will be baptized at the 9:00 service. You can probably guess that I am very excited about that! Sunday, February 14, is the last Sunday of Epiphany, The Transfiguration of our Lord. It is a Children in Church Day.

Wednesday, February 17 is Ash Wednesday. This will include our first Soup Supper and the Ash Wednesday Eucharist at 7:00pm. This solemn service includes the imposition of ashes.

Sunday February 21 is our Congregation Meeting. It will happen right after the 10:45 service. It is also the day that I meet with the First Communion Class during the 9:00 service.

Sunday, February 28 is another very special 50th Anniversary day. Pastor Jeanette Leisk will be here to preach at all three services. Pastor Leisk is a daughter of the congregation who attended seminary and now serves as Associate Pastor at St. James Lutheran Church in Gettysburg, PA. Pastor Leisk is a life-long Lutheran. She came to Good Shepherd while she was a physician here in Westborough. She was very active with adult learning, choir, and served as Chair of the Worship and Music Committee, just to scratch the surface. We are thrilled that Pastor Leisk will be able to return to Good Shepherd to help us celebrate. We are so blessed. We have much to celebrate. Don't miss all the excitement.

Words from Pastor Jeff

Are you ready? The church seasons are about to turn again. From the waiting of Advent, the birth on Christmas, and stories of Jesus' baptism and public ministry during the time after Epiphany, we now prepare for the altogether different rhythms of Lent.



The sanctuary and the worship will change their tone. From celebrative Sundays, we turn inward. Crosses will be covered and draped, hidden away for 40 days. Alleluias will grow scarce, for we know that Jesus has turned his face toward Jerusalem, and to the events of Holy Week that await him there.

What awaits you in your Lenten journey?

Take the first steps with us in worship on Ash Wednesday at 7:00 PM. Feel the black, gritty ashes trace the cross that resides on your forehead, and hear the eternal reminder: "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Or more bluntly, as Knute Ogren, our New England Synod Planned Giving consultant, told us at our

Endowment Fund lunch on January 10th, "You're going to die."

While Knute was referring to the endpoint of our life and our physical death, Lent invites us to ponder what needs to die in our spiritual and emotional lives. What barriers have we put up between ourselves and God that need to be removed? What walls need to be struck down?

For we know that whatever dies can be molded, shaped, and formed into a new and beautiful creation. Our lives of faith can be stripped clean so that God can make them deeper and stronger.

Join with us, and join with Jesus as we live and walk into the questions that Lent brings.

We all are one in mission

This first line of the hymn below will be the 2010 Stewardship theme for 2010; we will be singing this hymn on special occasions throughout the year; those of you working on Lenten Devotions will recognize the theme as well. The hymn goes like this:

We all are one in mission; we all are one in call, our varied gifts united by Christ, the Lord of all.

A single great commission compels us from above to plan and work together that all may know Christ's love.

We all are called to service, to witness in God's name. Our ministries are different, our purpose is the same: to touch the lives of others with God's surprising grace, so every folk and nation may feel God's warm embrace.

Now let us be united, and let our song be heard. Now let us be a vessel for God's redeeming Word.

We all are one in mission; we all are one in call, our varied gifts united by Christ, the Lord of all.

When we think about "mission", we may think about a missionary in a foreign land or a "secret mission" in a

war movie. However, the word "mission" - from the Latin word "mittere" - as a verb simply means "to send". Who is being sent? You and me! Who sends us? God! Where are we being sent to? To our neighbors and all those in need: "to touch the lives of others", as the hymn puts it in the 2nd verse. Why are you and I being sent? Because we have gifts that God wants us to share with others.

Missions can be great and small; "our ministries are different, our purpose is the same". Whether you are reaching out to a grieving neighbor, whether a child reaches out to a friend who is being bullied at school, whether we go on a mission trip to Honduras, all these are missions God is sending us to. The purpose is the same: "to touch the lives of others". You have experienced this yourself, that at times even the smallest sign of appreciation and love can sustain you, a smile, a shoulder to lean on, a person to talk with to share what happened in a difficult day at work. Being there for others - in missions great and small - the ability to listen and support is one of the many gifts we have received from God.

You and I are "stewards" of the manifold gifts you and I have received from God; "steward" is another of these foreign sounding words. But it simply derives from an old English word for house ("stig") and the root word "wer" = "to perceive, to watch out for" (you find this root word also in "aware", as example). A steward is keeping or administering the house or property of another - like you and me, who are not owning, but administering the property God has given us first: ourselves, our ability to love others and reach out to them, our talents, our financial resources - everything that makes you who you are.

Let us share our common call to mission, great and small, everyday, nearby and far away.

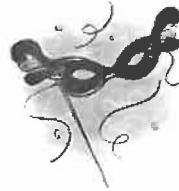

Twice a year we extend financial support to two different missions. Two of our favorites in the past have been Children's International and Calumet. Last January we reached out globally by giving Mrs. Allison \$185 to take to Honduras for the education of a middle school student for one year. The children were very proud of themselves and we hoped that this would expand their horizons help them see that we are called to serve 'all the world'.

And indeed it did! So far this year our Sunday School children have donated one to all of their Christian Coins earned in Sunday School to two very worthwhile causes:

- ❖ In November it was announced that 9 additional GSLC members would be traveling to Honduras with Mrs. Allison and the children donated \$274.50 worth of their coins to send along this year to help rebuild a house.
- ❖ And last month following the earthquake in Haiti, they donated \$217 worth of their coins.

They certainly have the joy, joy, joy, joy down in their hearts!
