**January 04, 2011 - NORTHBOROUGH, Mass.** – Melican Middle School eighth grader Elizabeth Wig was recently selected to participate in a new project launched by Gov. Deval Patrick to bring youth together from across the state to participate in community service projects.

This Saturday, Wig, along with other eighth graders from the other 350 communities in the commonwealth, will be participating in a day of community service as part of Project 351.

Project 351 is an initiative by Gov. Patrick and Lt. Gov. Tim Murray to integrate community service into their inauguration, which will be taking place this week.

Melican Principal Patricia Montimurro said the whole process happened very fast.

"The governor's office said they were looking for strong students who participate in community service and are interested in leadership," Montimurro said. "They asked us to give special consideration to kids whose parents are actively serving in the military, but we don't have any students like that."

When she was asked to choose one eighth grader, Montimurro decided to ask students to submit applications rather than have her try to choose students.

"Seven students submitted applications and any one of them could have represented our school," Montimurro said. "Elizabeth is a great kid, straight A/A+ student who is very active."

Wig thought the project sounded interesting and figured she might as well apply. She had no idea how many other students had applied and was surprised when she was actually selected.

Wig said she is very excited for Saturday, even though she has not been told yet where she will be volunteering.

"There are five different service projects and I'll be doing one of them," Wig said. "They are all about helping children in Massachusetts."

Wig is no stranger to community service, participating in a number of activities locally with her Girl Scout Troop and her church confirmation group.

"Without community service a lot of things wouldn't get done," Wig said. "People wouldn't have food, education or other important things. It makes everyone happier. I think its going to be a great experience."
