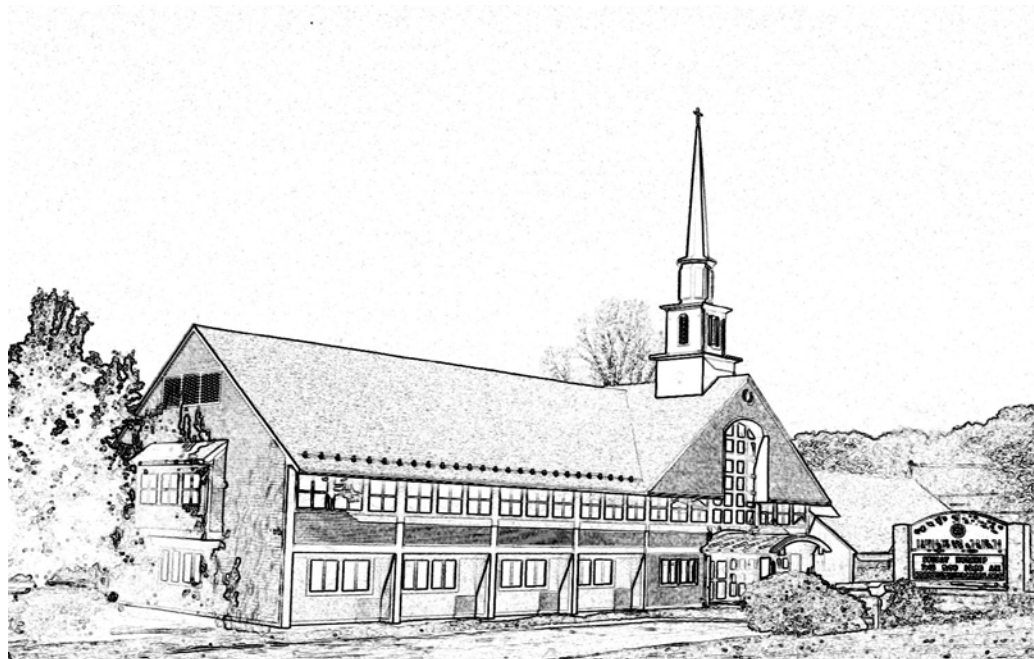

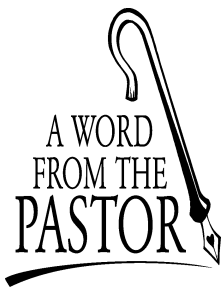

Dear Partners in Ministry,

Grace and peace be with you during our Lenten pilgrimage. Lent is a precious time of year. Seldom in our busy world is there much support for taking time for reflection and meditation. Lent is different. It comes with a call to slow down and take an accounting of how life is going. It invites, almost demands, quiet time for re-centering and rebalancing priorities. This is a wonderful gift. Do not allow this gift to go unopened. Now, I know that the word "Lent" refers to the lengthening of days in the springtime. However, when I was a child taking French in school, I learned that the word "lent" in French means "slow". Lent seemed slow to me then when I had given up chocolate or French Fries and our youth group was not allowed to party. But I have learned since then that Lent goes by all too quickly, especially if I keep putting off the good works, prayer, and fasting that get my life back in shape. *"See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation!" (2 Corinthians 6:2)* Please take the time for the journey. Walk with Christ through Lent and Holy Week. Then discover your joy renewed in the glory of Easter morning.

Besides Lent, there are a couple of other really important things happening at Good Shepherd right now. The first is the call process for our new musician. The Call committee is working very hard and doing a great job. At their first meeting, they elected Ernie Zimmerman to be Chair. The Committee also includes Nancy Matson, Bruce Grams, Abbey Cross, Mark Wanda, and Kathy Grim. Pastor Jeff and I are ex officio members. Pastor Laird from the Bishop's office is working with us. We have already received some very interesting resumes and applications. Tom Olson just told me that the mailbox he set up to receive resumes and applications is so full that it bounced someone's e-mail. That is bad, but it is also really exciting that we have generated so much interest. (Don't worry. He has more than doubled the size of the mailbox!!) I am very hopeful that we will find a musician with excellent skills and a heart for ministry and education. God is certainly in this process with us!

The other important undertaking right now is the visioning process. You probably remember that we have been trying to work on visioning since our anniversary. Perhaps there was just too much else happening, but we could not keep a process going with very much energy at that time. Things kept coming up that slowed us down. So, Pastor Jeff and I asked the Council to approve a different direction for visioning. The Council appointed a committee including Lisa Anzede, Brenda Calder, Suzanne Gillam, Nicole Harvell, Brad McRae, Jochen Salfeld, and Ernie Zimmerman. We have been meeting regularly to think about the direction for Good Shepherd in the next few years. We have discovered some very interesting things. First, it may be that the

lack of energy for visioning comes, at least in part, from the fact that we are pretty happy with the way things are right now. People join and continue to come to Good Shepherd because they find programs here that meet their needs. For example, many of us have children and find wonderful programs for children and youth in Sunday School, music, First Communion, Confirmation, TAGS and such. These families are not thinking about changes that need to happen because they are quite happy with what is happening now. We have found a way to move our thinking beyond satisfaction with the present. Ernie suggested a really fun exercise. He asked us to think about a ministry at Good Shepherd that we really feel passionate about. Then write a few paragraphs for the 60th anniversary booklet describing where that ministry is at that point. We are free to assume whatever miracles might be necessary to make it happen. That little exercise has opened our minds and hearts to God's possible future for Good Shepherd. We have now asked other leaders, the Council, committee members, and others who know us well, like other Conference pastors, the Bishop's office, ecumenical partners in Westborough, and others to contribute vision articles for our 2020 booklet as well. We are hoping to put them together in a "devotions style" book for the days between Easter and Pentecost. We are hoping these devotions will get the creative juices flowing in the congregation. Please watch for the books towards the end of April. Then read one person's vision each day. You may get excited by what you read or you may decide that is not the direction in which you hear God calling us. But, please take time each day to thank God for the ministry we are currently doing, ask God to bless and empower growth in that ministry, and listen for God's call to new ministry in our future. We will certainly be asking you to share what you hear in your listening time.

As always, thank you for your partnership in ministry.

"He will once again fill your mouth with laughter and your lips with shouts of joy." ~Job 8:21

Many worthwhile causes are celebrated during the month of April.

Some of them include

national volunteer week and earth day. One of my favorites is the recognition of national humor month. Laughter is a proven stress reducer and really can be "the best medicine". Below is an excerpt from the author and humorist Larry Wilde:

One night at dinner, Morgan said to his wife, "I have to admit I'm feeling much better since my operation, but I can't figure out why I got this big bump on my head."

"Oh, that!" said his spouse. "In the middle of your operation they suddenly ran out of ether."

Stress seems to be part of everybody's life. The United Nations International Labor Organization recently issued a report that states, "Stress has become one of the most serious health issues of our times."

There are many ways to contend with stress -- everything from jogging and paddle ball to biofeedback, aerobics and herbal tea. All these methods work to some extent but they take up precious time. The quickest, most effective way to beat stress is literally to laugh it off.

Why use humor in daily life? The answer is simple. You get immediate results. It takes no special talent or ability, no physical prowess or skill, you aren't required to have a master's degree or a license, it makes you feel good, it's fun, fat-free and you don't need batteries. A good laugh may be good for the heart. A team of Maryland medical researchers found that people with heart disease were 40 percent less likely to laugh in humorous situations than those with healthy hearts. "The old saying that laughter is the best medicine definitely appears to be true when it comes to protecting your heart," says Michael Miller, director of the Center of Preventive Cardiology at the University of Maryland Medical Center.

The healthful benefits of laughter are cause for great celebration among psychologists. They now recognize the therapeutic value of humor in the workplace and have begun to prescribe it for their patients. Daniel Goleman, writing in The New York Times, states that

"humor can aid problem-solving as well as contribute to creativity in the business environment." The Times article quotes David Abramis, a psychologist in the School of Business Administration at California State University (Long Beach) on his survey of 382 people from a wide variety of workplaces. Abramis found that "those who felt their work was fun performed better and got along better with co-workers than did those who were satisfied with their jobs but did not see them as fun."

The knowledge that it is possible to cope more easily with stress by emphasizing humor has already had a profound effect on the international business community. Now companies are profiting from lessons in laughter. Corporations are hiring humor consultants for training sessions to help execs loosen up, so they can take their work seriously without taking themselves too seriously. Mark H. McCormick, the premier sports business manager and author of *What They Don't Teach You At Harvard Business School*, writes "Laughter is the most potent, constructive force for diffusing business tension. If you can point out what is humorous or absurd about a situation or confrontation, you will be guaranteed the upper hand."

Important meetings, presentations or job interviews can become highly stressful confrontations. Loosening up with a couple of chuckles beforehand sharpens your concentration and pleasantly prepares you for a positive and successful approach. "Laughter is the best way to start a meeting," states McCormick. "You don't need to have them falling in the aisles. But a mildly pleasant remark at the outset will create the right atmosphere for everything that follows."

*The Chairman of the Board of Directors of a Chicago charity called the monthly meeting to order. "I have rather a stressful order of business," he announced. "We're looking for a treasurer."
"But we appointed a treasurer just six months ago."
"Yes," said the Chairman. "That's the treasurer we're looking for."*

Using humor to relieve stress is simple -- the benefits are simply wonderful!

What is a real family budget?

There is much in the news on the Federal budget these days, and one running argument by some is that the Federal Government should do what families do, and live within its means. But what does that mean?

I sometimes read the "Money Makeover" section in the Sunday Globe, and after some description of a specific family circumstance come the "prescriptions", and one of them that shows up with some regularity is to develop a real understanding where the money goes.

When I left home the first time and went to Heidelberg University my mom gave me a booklet, along with good motherly advice to write down my daily expenses every evening. While the entries are not very exciting, it helped me to control my spending and live on my limited budget as a university student (nobody had credit cards at the time.., which was good)

So what is a family budget? All of us look at and plan for large spending items – mortgage, insurance, car payments, tuition etc. – but how many really know where the money goes on a daily basis? The experts from the "Money Makeover" section would want all of us to plan for our smaller expenses, and keep track even of small incidental expenses.

While this may be too much on a daily basis – with all the other demands on our time – doing this for a few weeks may be very informative. The longer we do it the better the foundation for developing a reliable, average weekly expense figure. And using that average weekly figure we can put together an annual spending plan, which incorporates small and large expenses for the

year (even charitable giving and planned spending for birthday and Christmas gifts).

If we want to show the Federal government how to do it, we all need to work a little harder, but would be so much better informed.

REPORT FROM THE TREASURER

As of February 28, 2011

We are slightly behind budget in February. The summary table below is a snapshot of our financial picture as of February 28, 2011.

Our operating revenue lagged behind expenses for the month, but was made up by strong investment income in the month. The payroll error I mentioned last month was supposed to be corrected in February, but was not. The Payroll Administrator will make the correction in March, which will reduce salary expense by \$830.

Important highlights for the month are as follows:

- Operating Revenue was \$4,116 lower than budget
- Investment earnings were strong at \$2,376, which helped the Operating Revenue
- Operating Expenses were \$1,677 lower than budget, but should have been \$2,507 lower than budget if the payroll error had not occurred.

It is important to continue to practice good expense management and look for creative ways to finance our various programs.

The current year to date is favorable compared to last year. Our Operating Revenue for the year through February 2011 was \$84,082, which is \$8,709 higher than 2010. In addition, our Operating Expenses are slightly lower than last year, at \$89,090 compared to \$89,709 in 2010. The net result is that our operating loss of \$1,205 this year is \$13,402 better than the loss of \$14,606 in 2010.





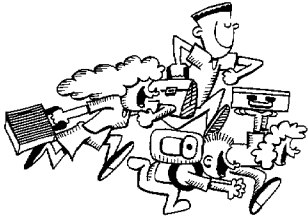
